"Since you dare oppose our Astron family, be prepared to meet your end!" Tom bellowed, poised to deliver a fatal strike to Arthur.


A bitter smile appeared on Arthur's face. He hadn't anticipated that his decision to protect Liam might lead to his own demise.

As he spoke, Tom's eyes shifted as he quickly formulated a plan. At present, the most effective way to make Caden less angry at him was to shift the blame to someone else.




After saying that, Tom was smug about his manipulation.
